STATE FACTS

Connecticut State Tax Policy: Significant changes, 2005-2014

- Note: Prior to 2011, the state had relied heavily on borrowing to avoid tax increases.
- **2013:** Corporate tax surcharge--extended for an additional two years, applied to 2014 and 2015 income years.
- **2011:** Tax increases total \$2.1 billion in the first year of the biennium (2012) and \$1.9 billion in the second (2013).
- **2010:** Municipal real estate conveyance tax—extended for one year
- **2009:** Corporation tax surcharge—10% tax for three years, retroactive to Jan. 1, 2009; Corporation combined-reporting preference tax—increased from \$250,000 to \$500,000
- **2005:** Daily rental machinery tax—surcharge of 1.5% on rental cost of certain construction, mining, and forestry equipment; Real estate conveyance tax—extends rate of 0.25% through July 1, 2007
