Meet MARY - Neighbor and Survivor

When I was 18 years old I was diagnosed with a rare blood disorder, Paroxysmal Nocturnal Hemoglobinuria. For the next 18 years I had surgeries, treatments and over 100 blood transfusions to keep me alive. In the fall of 2007 we discovered that my disorder was becoming more severe and a bone marrow transplant was needed for me to survive. Finding a perfect match (10 out of 10) for my transplant was my best chance for survival. I am so fortunate that Yvonne, a woman in Germany, registered to be a bone marrow donor and agreed to help me, a complete stranger! I'm happy to say it has been 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ years since my transplant and I am doing fabulous! I got my life back. I am currently residing in Fairfield and teach at Masuk High School in Monroe, CT.
