- 1. henThomas May, CEO of Northeast Utilities, gave \$10,000 to the federal account. NU is a state contractor. NU execs gave a total of \$45,000.
- 2. Adam Winstanley and Carter J. Winstanley principals of Winstanley Enterprises, developer of Downtown Crossing in New Haven. They each gave \$10,000 last year, as did a third partner. Its anchor tenant, Alexion Pharmaceuticals, is relocating with \$51 million in incentives from the state.
