With this letter, I wish to congratulate the Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH) for their leadership by organizing the first annual "Green Mass" to celebrate the Irish Catholic Community in the Norwich Diocese. It is very fitting that the Mass be held at the Cathedral of Saint Patrick in Norwich as Saint Patrick is the Patron Saint of Ireland as well as the Patron Saint of the Diocese of Norwich.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians has a long history in the Diocese of Norwich. The first Division was established in New London in 1871 and was named after its Chaplain, Reverend Thomas P. Joynt, Pastor of Saint Mary, Star of the Sea Church in New London. Most Reverend Daniel A. Hart, the Fourth Bishop of Norwich, was the New London's Division Chaplain until his death in 2008.

Let us ask Our Lady, Queen of the Rosary, during the month of October dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to bless with success our campaign to engage the women of our Diocese in the prayer, work, and life of the Norwich Diocesan Council of Catholic Women. Through the intercession of Our Lady of Good Counsel, our Diocesan Council's Patroness, may the Lord bless you and you loved ones!

Through the intercession of our diocesan patrons, Saint Patrick and Saint Anne, may the Lord bless all the members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and their families during this Lenten season.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Who are the AOH?

A. The Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH) is America's oldest Irish Catholic Fraternal Organization, founded in May, 1836. The Order can trace its roots back to a series of similar societies that existed in Ireland for more than 300 years. The AOH evolved from a need in the early sixteen-hundreds to protect the lives of priests who risked immediate death to keep the Catholic Faith alive in occupied Ireland after the reign of England's King Henry VIII. The Norwich AOH, founded in 1871, ceased to exist in 1986, leaving the New London and Hartford divisions as the only divisions in eastern Connecticut.

Q. What does the AOH do?

A. The mission of the AOH is to promote Irish Culture, Community and Christian Charity. In 2014, our division fed the New London homeless, hosted talks and lectures to promote Irish History and Culture, and supported local churches in our area.

Q. How can I become a Hibernian?

A. Membership in the AOH is open to men of Irish Heritage who are practicing Catholics. If you would like to become a member, please contact the division closest to your home. Information on the Divisions in Connecticut is listed below.
