This situation silences those without the technological means or financial resources to engage via virtual platforms, impeding their democratic right to express their views. To foster a comprehensive and well-rounded discourse regarding the proposed regulations and their multifaceted impacts across diverse socioeconomic strata, it is essential that we do not exclusively accommodate individuals with access to modern communication tools. Our intention should be to ensure that all segments of society are represented in this dialogue, rather than solely amplifying the voices of those who can comfortably embrace an electric vehicle mandate. I am confident that you share my perspective, recognizing the practicality and alignment with democratic principles in my proposal.

To this end, I strongly advocate for at least one-week postponement of the hearing, allowing for an in-person session to convene.
